Upcoming meetings: July 7 & August 4 (all meetings are at the Griggs Hunter Ed room @ 7pm)

We will be having meetings in July and August. We have cancelled these meetings in years past due to low attendance, but in looking at the number of new members we have been getting each month, we decided to hold the normal meetings as scheduled so that prospective new members will have an opportunity to join. We also have a lot of business going on this summer, so we expect to discuss several key topics at each meeting. So if you are in town and available, please attend.

Our annual Women & Youth introduction to shooting was a huge success. We had over 40 participants this year, and all of them seemed to have a good time! We will have our annual hunter sight in days on September 11 and September 24. We will be open to the public, free of charge on those days to sight in hunting rifles. You may have noticed an article and an editorial in the Tri-City Herald recently regarding one of our possible future ranges. It appears that we won't be able to build a range on that particular parcel at this time due to the Benton County zoning ordinance and the State Growth Management Act. We are still working on some other possibilities in Franklin County. Rest assured that we won't give up until we have something suitable secured for the future.

If you have been to the range lately, you might have noticed that our vegetation control program has been a huge success this year. With the wet spring we have had, we would have been buried under several feet of rapidly drying wildfire fuel if we had not sprayed it when we did. We are now reaching the time of year where fire hazard is extreme, so please be ever vigilant with fire safety. Also remember that the edges of the entrance road have not been sprayed, so be especially careful not to start a fire on your way in or out.

We have several new steel gongs set up at 100 and 200 yards, and we are glad to see that they are getting heavy use. We are not as happy to see the **ABUSE** they are taking. Intentional shooting of the chains that hold the gongs up and shooting the gongs with steel core or armor piercing rounds are both considered abuse. These things have happened in the last month, to the point that the targets are nearly destroyed already. We heard a lot of complaints the last time we removed the steel targets, but if they are a maintenance or safety problem, we will remove them again. If you see someone abusing the targets or otherwise breaking club rules, fill out an incident report form and mail it to the club address or give an officer a call. Anyone caught violating the rules will be disciplined, including possible expulsion from the club for major violations.

**CMP Highpower:** (match director Gaylord Baker 628-9044)

At the June 4, 2011 regular club match, the top three shooters were: Gaylord Baker (765-17x), Dave Baalman (737-18x) & Marlee Parks (730-11x). At the M-1 Garand match on June 4, 2011, the top three shooters were: Gaylord Baker (452-4x), Bill High (435-1x), and Dave Baalman (427-4x). CMP Highpower matches are open to any military issue rifle with iron sights. We shoot an 80 round course of fire from standing, sitting and prone positions, plus up to five sighter shots. Several of our competitors bring extra equipment like jackets & mats that you can borrow to try the sport out.

At the May 28 three gun challenge, the top three shooters & times were: Dave Baalman (164.82 sec), Aaron Woodbury (181.14 sec), and Dave Cook (182.92 sec). At the June 11 three gun challenge, the top three shooters & times were: Brian Humann (119.47 sec), Dave Baalman (140.01 sec), and Tom Conrads (157.07 sec). Many people have asked us to describe what a three gun challenge is all about. Think of it this way: imagine if you invited 15 of your closest gun nut friends to a barbecue at the range, but forgot to bring any food. What would everyone do to entertain themselves while you went to town to get some hot dogs? They would drag out whatever guns they have in the car and organize an informal, fun competition that would look a lot like our version of a three gun challenge. We compete using a rifle, a pistol and a shotgun on a course designed to challenge everyone, but conquer no one. You are really only competing against yourself, and it is as much a social event as a competition. So come on out and join us, we will loan you one or more guns if you don't have something to use for one of the stages.
