We have some items that we want your opinion on. We have been using this new newsletter format for several months now, and we want to know what you think. We also want to know what you think of the phone tree. We have been discussing ways to cut costs and redundancy in the administration of the club, and see an opportunity in these two areas. Currently the phone tree costs the club approximately \$500 per year in work party credit, while the newsletter costs around \$1900 per year in postage & printing fees. We definitely cram a lot more information in the newsletter, and we are confident that over 90% of the club members receive it each month. We have the phone tree set up so that only those members who receive the newsletter by US Mail get a call each month (which is about 50% of the club), while the others receive the newsletter and the info that goes out on the phone tree in one email. But we are still relying on 20+ people to make the calls each month, and to pass on the message that they are supposed to pass on. Many of the callers do that very well, but we are certain that some of them are not making their calls regularly. The nice part of the phone tree is that it does not cost extra to make additional calls each month, so if something comes up after the newsletter goes out, we can reach everyone without additional expense, however this is not something we have had to use recently. We want your opinion at the next meeting about where we should go with these programs. We see three options: 1) Continue as we have been doing with monthly newsletters and monthly calls to those who don't receive the newsletter by email. 2) Drop the phone tree and continue monthly newsletters. 3) Continue the phone tree and switch to quarterly newsletters.

We are looking for someone to help out with new member orientation. Dave Baalman has been giving the orientation every month for over three years. Before that, it was Bill High for about the same amount of time. We would like to set up a committee of a couple of members to handle the orientation on a rotating basis, so that we can spread the work load around a bit and keep everyone from getting burned out. That's the end of our registered matches for the year, but we will be shooting club matches starting on October 29. This is a great opportunity to come out and learn the sport without the pressure of shooting in a registered match, so please join us!

For those of you who weren't at the August match, the CMP has recently enacted a new loading rule for rapid fire stages, which we are now enforcing. You must close your bolt on an empty chamber and then insert a loaded magazine. After you move into position, you can cycle the action and begin firing, but you must move into position on an empty chamber.

We have had quite a few new shooters this year, and we notice that most of them have become regulars, so they must be having fun! We hope to see you there too, we will be more than willing to help you get started.
